The largest national park in <b>Kenya</b> is called the Maasai Mara. Its animals include lions, cheetahs, elephants, zebras and hippos. It is a three hour drive away from <b>Nairobi</b>.</li> </ul>
What is the <b>climate</b> like in <b>Kenya</b> ?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The <b>climate</b> is warm and temperate in <b>Nairobi</b> but there is a significant amount of rainfall during the year. There is a wet season and dry season.</li> </ul>
What are the similarities and differences between Kenya and the UK?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The <b>climate</b> is very different in both countries.</li> <li>• Culture in both <b>countries</b> is different.</li> <li>• The differences and similarities in the landscapes.</li> </ul>

Africa	the second largest <b>continent</b>
camouflage	a way of hiding something by covering or colouring like it's surroundings
capital city	London is the <b>capital city</b> of England and the UK
climate	the usual weather conditions
compass	is a tool for finding direction
continent	a large land mass split into <b>countries</b>
country	an area of land that is controlled by its own government
equator	an imaginary line around the middle of the Earth between the Tropics
hemisphere	the top or bottom half of the Earth
herbivore	animals that only eat plants
humid	a warm and damp, moist <b>climate</b>
Kenya	a <b>country</b> within the <b>continent</b> of <b>Africa</b>
Maasai	the name of the tribe that live in <b>Kenya</b>
mammal	an animal that breathes air, has a backbone, grows hair and can produce milk for their young
Nairobi	the <b>capital city</b> of <b>Kenya</b>
nocturnal	animals that are mainly active during the night
ocean	a huge body of salt water
pride	a group of lions
tribe	a group of people that share a <b>culture</b>
safari	an expedition to see animals in the wild
savannah	a grassy plain in tropical and subtropical regions
temperate	means moderate, most places with a temperate climate have four seasons
