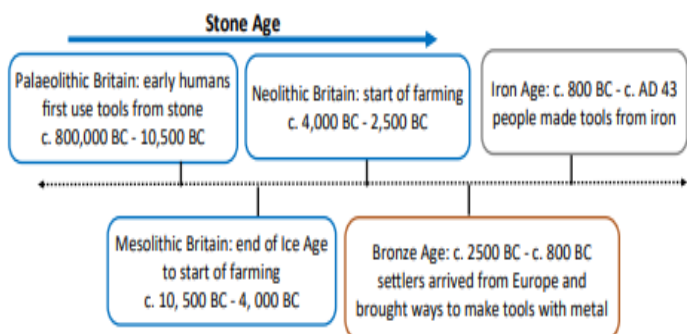




**What should I already know?**

- The Stone Age was followed by the Bronze Age and then the Iron Age.



- The Iron Age started in 800 BC and ended in 43 AD.
- The Ancient Egypt civilisation began around the time of the Bronze Age in Britain.
- In 30 BC the Romans conquered Ancient Egypt and brought an end to the ways of this successful civilisation.
- The Romans invaded Britain and brought an end to the ways of the Iron Age and prehistoric Britain.
- London is the capital city of England in the UK.

**Important Facts that I will learn**

- In 44 AD, The Romans captured Colchester, England. It was the first fortress in Roman Britain and it was made the capital city in AD 49.
- The Romans established themselves in Britain and developed: paved straight roads and infrastructure e.g. a sewage system.
- They also influenced the: written and spoken language, measurement system, way of life, built cities, buildings (made out of bricks and stone), technology and religion (Christianity).
- Roman Britain created a nation rather than a number of tribes.
- In 61 AD, Queen Boudica led a rebellion against the Romans.

**Vocabulary**

artefact	object from the past that provides evidence of what life was like
Boudica	queen and leader of the Iceni tribe who led a rebellion against the Roman invasion in Britain
emperor	ruler of an empire
empire	number of nations under the rule of a single leader or emperor
fortress	castle or large building designed to be hard for enemies to enter
infrastructure	basic facilities such as transport, power supplies and buildings
invade	to take over a place by force
Jutes	people from the Jutland Peninsula (Germany and Southern Denmark) who invaded Britain around 410 AD
Picts	ancient tribes from Northern Scotland
raid	a sudden armed attack on a place
rebellion	fighting back against an invasion or attack
Roman	relating to the Roman Empire or ancient Rome
Rome	city in Italy
Scots	people from Ireland who eventually settled in Scotland
settlers	people who migrate to a new place
technology	devices resulting from scientific knowledge being used for practical purposes
tribe	group of people of the same race, language, and culture
