Florence Nightingale	a nurse during the Crimean War
hospital	a place where sick or injured people are given medical or surgical treatment
impact	making a significant change.

Queen Victoria	was Queen from 1837 until her death in 1901, 63 years
society	a group of individuals living in a community
Victorian	a person that lived at the time of Queen Victoria's reign

Time line

1820: Florence Nightingale was born on the 12th May in Florence, Italy. She was named after her place of birth.

1837: At 17, she believed she was called into service by God, to do something towards helping the suffering.

1858: Florence Nightingale was made a superintendent at a medical

1849: Florence Nightingale travelled to Europe to study the European Hospital

1853: The Crimean War broke out.

1854: Florence Nightingale went to Turkey to help the soldiers. Florence Nightingale made sure that the hospitals were clean so saved many lives.

1855: Lots of people gave money to the **Nightingale** Fund to help train more

1910: Florence Nightingale died.

1856: The Crimean War ended.
1857: Florence Nightingale returned home.
