

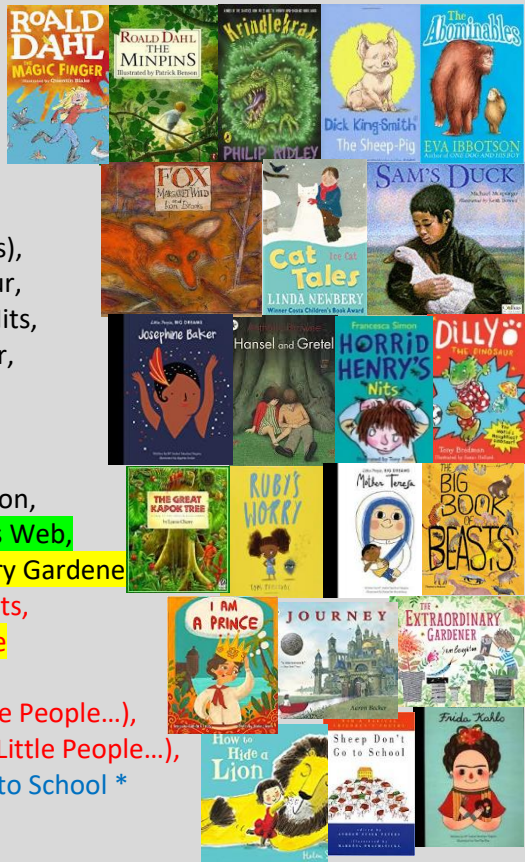

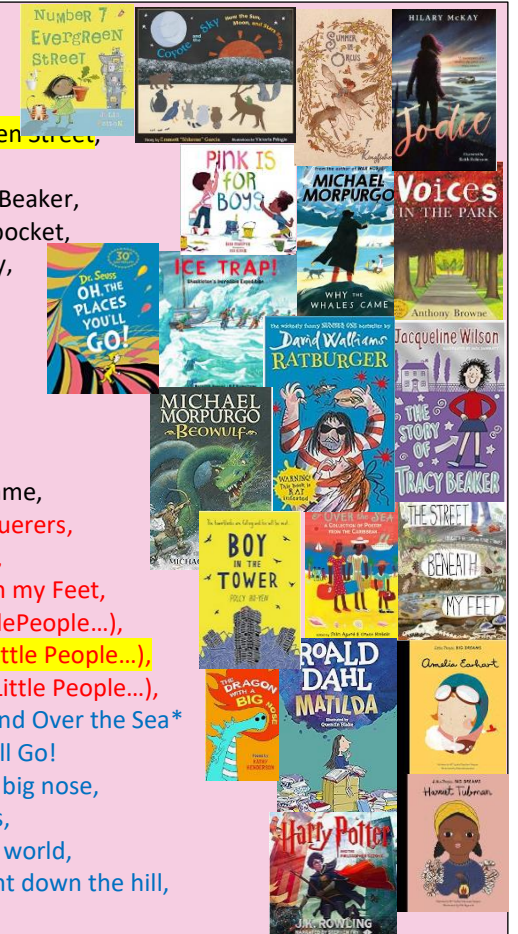

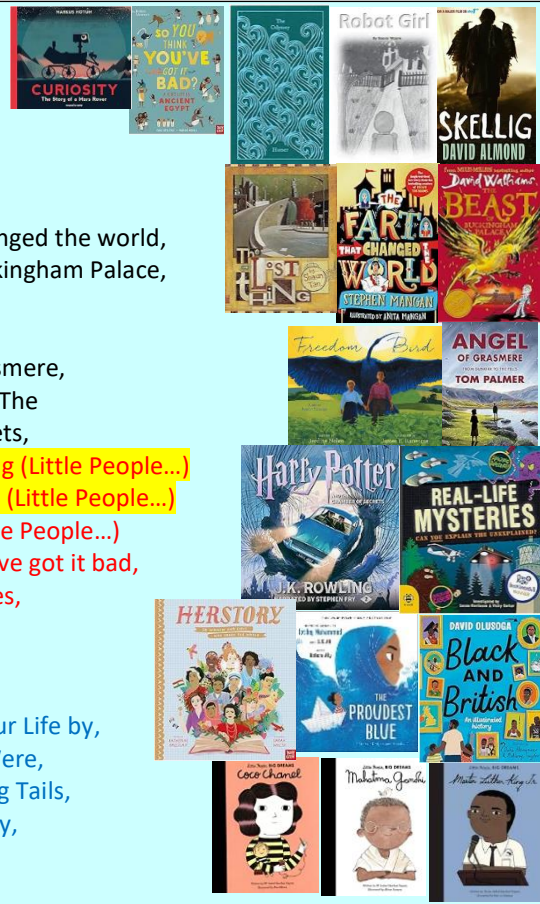

## Suggested Book Spine for Reading Time

At Richmond Hill we have created a Reading Spine for each class to read daily to promote a love of reading. These books have been purposefully chosen to excite both children and staff and to help make a difference to their life chances, whatever their socio-economic background.

Each year group has a mixture of fiction, non-fiction, LGBTQ+ and poetry books. Within the poetry there is a mixture of both narrative poems and collections of poems. The collections can be dipped into over the year and a few pages can be read between other books so that poetry is heard regularly by pupils.

Respect. Confidence. Support. Friendship. Kindness. Being Safe. Honesty. Happiness

Each class also has 3 Little People biography books (one per term). Within the 3 inspirational people books there is at least one person of colour and at least one inspirational woman. This is to promote diversity and also women, which is one of our curriculum divers as a school due to our locality.



Within the fiction, there is at least one story which promotes diversity in society (except in Y6 where it is in the non-fiction section.)

All KS2 classes have a wordless picture book to evoke conversation (speaking and listening), spark curiosity and imagination, and encourage predictions.

KS2 literacy texts are not included as they are read during lessons - not just for enjoyment at the end of the day.
