Safeguarding –It's everyone's responsibility. If you have concerns about a child/ young person, you can contact the Safeguarding Hub on 0333 240 1727. Safeguarding children includes ensuring that they do not have access to inappropriate TV, films/DVDs, You Tube, games etc. Ensure you have parental controls on devices at home and always check age classification before allowing your child to view/play. Some games, films are violent, graphic and are completely inappropriate for primary age children. Social media also have age limits – so regularly check what your child is accessing.

Sharing Photographs on Social Media – Please remember that school has permission from parents to post photographs on our school Facebook page, but you as parents do not have permission from other parents. For that reason, any photographs the school shares on Facebook or on Tapestry, cannot be then shared by you.

Medical Conditions - If your child has a medical condition, including allergies to food or allergies to other things, we must be informed as a matter of urgency. All children with asthma must have an in date inhaler in school, clearly labelled with their name. Children with Epi-pens must have two in date Epi-pens in school, clearly labelled with their name. It is the responsibility of parents to keep us informed and up-to-date with medical conditions and with the appropriate medication.



Sickness Absence & Holidays in Term Time – As you know, school attendance is very important. If your child is poorly or off school for any other reason, please ring the school office on 016973 20650 by 8.45am on the first morning of absence. Holidays in term time are **NOT AUTHORISED** except in very exceptional circumstances. You must email the Head Teacher via, admin@richill.cumbria.sch.uk, outlining the special circumstances. A leave request form must be completed in advance. Each request will be considered on a case by case basis following very strict government guidelines. You are liable to a fine and/prosecution if your child's leave is unauthorised. Please support your child's education by not taking them out of school during the term. Thank you.

Earrings and Uniform

As has always been the case at Richmond Hill, children are **not** permitted to wear earrings. Please ensure earrings are removed before children attend school. This is a long standing policy for health and safety reasons and we will not be deviating from it. Please look on our website for our full uniform policy.
